BALH Local History Day will be held at Conway Hall, 25 Red Lion Square, London WC1R 4RL. This includes two presentations on topical aspects of local history demonstrating up to date research in progress. In recognition of the centenary of the Representation of the People Act 1918, which gave the vote to some women, Professor Krista Cowman, University of Lincoln, will give a presentation on the extension of the suffrage. The Annual Lecture will be given by Dr Rose Wallis from the University of the West of England, entitled, 'Rulers of the County': the magistracy and the challenge of local government, c.1790-1834. Also included is the presentation of BALH awards for Local History achievements, the Annual General Meeting, bookstalls, and society displays.
